The Trust is currently working in partnership with the Local Authority to improve the building at Ranelagh and to improve the Resource Provision at North Beckton. We have also been successful in obtaining bids from National Government for essential building work at Ranelagh and Kensington. At Curwen, with existing funds and with extra money raised by the community, a new Sensory Bus has now been ordered and should be in place for December 2019.

The Trust has also made significant improvement to the ICT facilities at our schools which will not only impact on how we use ICT but also by improving the Wi-Fi structures and connectivity.
