Homework

English

In English, pupils will extend their reading and writing skills as they engage with the following texts:

- The Land of Neverbelieve
- Voices in the Park
- The Tunnel
- Egyptian Myths
- George's Marvellous Medicine

How you can support your child's learning in English:

- Encourage children to write an information text on a topic of their choice using the skills learnt in school, fronted adverbials, expanded noun phrases and conjunctions.
- Visit a library and borrow books for free.
- Test your child on their spellings each week and ask them to build a sentence with one or two words from the spelling.
- Encourage your child to write an imaginative story and diary entries.

Maths

In Maths we will be exploring:

- Measurement: Money & Time
- Geometry: Properties of Shapes
- Statistics

How you can support your child's learning in Maths

- Talk about different containers in your house and how many litres (l) or millilitres (ml) they contain.
- Get children to measure the capacity (ml) of containers and add them together.
- Ask children what the time is throughout the day.
- Ask your child to work out time intervals between two activities at the weekend (hours and minutes).
- Take your child on a 3D shape hunt in your local area.
- Ask your child to give reasons for their steps taken to solve the problem.

Science

In Science, the children will be learning about Plants and Light.

How you can support your child's learning in Science

- Plant some seeds with children. Give them the responsibility to water these each day.
- Observe the growth of different types of plants.
- Create a weekly diary and note down the growth of a plant.
- Ask your child how different flowers and trees spread their seeds.
- Discuss ways to protect our eyes from the sun.

Computing

How you can support your child's learning in Computing

- Talk to your child about how to stay safe online. Here are a couple of links to support you.

In Summer 2, Children will be studying about Ancient Egypt where they will learn about how people lived and what they believed.

How you can support your child's learning

- Look at how land has been used around your local area and places in the world.
- Look at human and physical features in your local area.
- Discuss the differences and similarities between rural and urban areas. Why are they both important?
- Ask your child about the key vocabulary that they have learnt in school. What do these words mean?
- Have a fun "Ancient Egypt day" where you can dress up, build pyramids using blocks, or make simple Egyptian-style artwork together.
