Please encourage your child to read for at least 20 minutes every day.

Your child will bring home a reading book from their class library every Tuesday and should be returned the following Tuesday.

General Information

We will have PE on **Wednesdays** and **Fridays**.

English

This term, learning will be based on these texts:

- *The Talking Skull* - Traditional African tale
- *High-Rise Mystery* by Sharna Jackson - a detective story
- *The Shepherd King* - A tale from Eastern Europe
- *Harjit Singh-World War One Flying Ace* by Bali Rai
- Poetry linked to WW1

How you can support your child's learning

- Ask your children to tell you about the stories they are reading: Who are the characters? What are the main events? What do they like/dislike about the stories?
- Test your child on their spellings from the homework each week.
- Ensure your child reads daily for at least 20 minutes.

Maths

- Recognising and understanding numbers up to ten million
- Written addition, subtraction, multiplication and division methods
- Rounding numbers
- Negative numbers
- Comparing and ordering numbers
- Fractions
- Measuring - converting units

How you can support your child's learning

- Encourage your children to use the TT Rockstars and Maths Prodigy websites.
- Quick-fire multiplication or division facts in the car, kitchen, or while walking.
- Use j2e blast for arithmetic practice
- Involve your child in daily maths tasks, e.g. calculating change, budgeting spending or measuring ingredients.

Science

- Fair Testing
- Light - Exploring how light travels and how we see
- Living things and their habitats
- Planning and carrying out investigations

How you can support your child's learning

- Carry out a hunt for living things in your local park or garden and discuss how the habitat meets their needs.
- Use a torch and everyday objects to see how shadows change size when the distance or angle of the torch changes.
- Encourage your child to carry out investigations, researching the topics covering and questioning the world and their surroundings.

Computing

- **Computing systems and networks** - Communication and collaboration
- **Creating media** – Web page creation

Ranelagh Curriculum

This term, our pupils are embarking on an exciting journey to explore Our Changing World. We will be taking a close look at how our planet is changing, how climate change affects our daily lives, and what it really means to live sustainably. The children will share ideas and discover simple, practical ways we can work together to become a more sustainable community.

You can help bring our topic to life at home with a simple weekend walk! Take a short walk around your neighborhood together. Ask your child to spot three human features (like houses, shops, or roads) and three natural features (like trees, parks, or rivers). See if they can spot anything that helps the environment (like solar panels, recycling bins, or bike paths). Ask your child: "What is one thing our family or neighborhood could do to be even greener?"

Watch the news with your children and discuss current events concerning the climate crisis, such as wildfires, flooding or melting glaciers. Discuss ways we can reduce our carbon footprint to battle the climate crisis.

Later in the term, we will be exploring the key events of World War 1. Watch short clips or documentaries made for children (e.g., BBC Teach or Newsround). Discuss what life was like for children during World War 1.
